### Electric December: Caught In The Middle 16 December

Gun and knife crime seems to dominate many present day headlines, and on day 16, a 90 second trailer for a 10 minute film – ‘Caught in the Middle’ – created by youth group TFA and media firm StreetScenes, addresses many of the issues that young people face and warns about the danger of carrying and using weapons following the fatal stabbing of 22 year old Linval Wright over 2 years ago.

The full-length film has been developed into a resource to be distributed to schools, youth clubs and youth offender institutes nation-wide, to deliver the message ‘wishing lives were not lost to knives’
